## **Narrow Boat Cruise**

Recently at an after race Catalina Bowling Club meal, we got talking to Will and Sue who were planning to travel to the UK. They were most interested when Kerry and I told them about our canal experience in a hired narrow boat.

This is a reprint of an article from 2015 that may inspire others who are contemplating a trip to England.

## A CRUISE OF A NARROW KIND

For decades I've had a dream to chug along an English Canal in a narrow boat. I've watched the TV series, multiple YouTube videos and talked to those who have. This year in July my wife Kerry and I concluded a self drive and B&B trip around Scotland and England with a five day narrow boat hire.

Our chosen canal was the Llangollen Canal straddling the Wales/England border. We caught the Virgin tilt train from London to Chester, changing to a local rail service that dropped us at Chirk. It was then a quick taxi trip to the Chirk marina.

Marinas on the canal system are large excavated ponds off the side of the canal. We had chosen Crest Narrowboats as the hirer. They reviewed well on Trip Adviser and had a shorter boat suitable for a crew of two. When I say short, it was still 45 feet long but some narrowboats reach 70 feet which need bow thrusters to help steer them around the canals. All narrowboats are 6' 6" wide to fit the narrow sections of which there are many. We had a very thorough briefing before being guided out into the main canal aboard "Anne".



Anne was in excellent condition and contained a double cabin, ensuite with shower (seemed bigger than some of the B&Bs we had stayed at), dinette and large galley complete with full stove, half fridge and microwave. There was a four cylinder diesel that pushed the 18 tonne boat along at the maximum 4mph "purposeful postman" pace. The engine used less than one and a half litres per hour, better than my 8HP outboard.

Once you identify the pivot point for steering, about a third way back from the bow, steering is easy but your attention can't wander for too long or you'll be into the bank.

The canal system was developed in the late 1700s and early 1800s to supply materials for the industrial revolution. It was before steam engines so early canal barges were pulled by horses. There are still a few examples of this, one being at LLangollen.



On one side of the canal you have a tow path owned by British Waterways and the other side is private land. The canal system in England is all connected so you can reach London from Llangollen via Stratford or maybe a diversion to Bath or maybe up to York or Birmingham or..... So the tow paths are also used by touring cyclists and walkers.

It wasn't long before we were into our first long tunnel. You check for headlights before entering but often you follow other boats through.

This is where you become aware of a narrowboat idiosyncrasy. In the narrow sections like bridges, tunnels and aquaducts, if you have the current against you, the boat acts like a floating weir and soon you are pushing against an increasing head of water. This requires more throttle which then causes the stern to push out to port with prop torque. So you gently crab your way along bumping into the sides. Now you see why they are made out of 9mm steel plate.



The scenery towards Llangollen was stunning, a feature of this canal. We were soon at the other feature. The Pontcysylltre Aquaduct. This is a high, long and slender aquaduct high above the River Dee. It is one of the built wonders of the world. We swung the bend and across with the tow path and fence on one side and nothing on the other. The riveted cast iron side of the aquaduct finishes about 8 inches above the waterline. We were too busy and awe inspired to be scared.

When in comes evening you look up your guide and decide which pub you will have dinner at and what bridge number that will be. When you reach your stop, you tie up next to the tow path and

walk a short distance to dinner to eat local meals and drink local ales.

For five days we pottered along the canal turning at Ellesmere for the return to Chirk. If you try to cover maximum



distance then you have missed the whole point of canal travel. Everyone is so friendly. This canal attracts many hire boats so people come from all over the world. Queuing at a loch is a chance to meet and chat. So many eccentrics from around the world travellers, live aboards, all summer cruisers and Bohemians complete with their suspicious looking pot plants. One gent showed off his highly polished 1936 twin cylinder Lister that chugged at 400rpm. He said "It goes tedump, tedump, just like a heat beat".

The countryside varied from English garden, quaint villages, open farms and forests where you expect to see men in tights. We navigated four long tunnel transits, four aquaduct crossings, four loch elevations, numerous but not hard bumps and a few minor groundings.

Handover of "Anne" was seamless and pleasant but I had a similar feeling to that when I 've walked three daughters down the aisle. It is so unfortunate that we don't have a canal system in Australia. Our development was in the later railway period. To me, it was so like sailing as it is

not about the destination, it is all about the journey and the interesting people you meet along the way. I'm still looking at YouTube videos of canal life.



Unsuitable for our RV so Peter and Jacqui Armstrong kindly offered Sharon and I to travel in their Toyota Landcruiser. Good decision, as we thoroughly enjoyed Peter and Jacqui's company and stories whilst looking over the Liverpool Plains and steep valleys, narrow roads and high land grazing paddocks whilst driving to Coolah Tops.

During the drive we used CB radios to communicate for safety as oncoming traffic sometimes required us to pull off the road to allow passing.

# NOTICE OF RACE - SPRING SERIES 2023 V1.0

## 1 RULES

- 1.1 The races will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, the Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Australian Sailing Category 7 and any amendments, each yacht's Class Rules (except where any of these are altered by the Sailing Instructions), and the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2 All races will be "Mixed Class Races" and spinnakers may be flown.
- 1.3 Each race is required to have a minimum of 4 boats signed on to start the race (excluding the Officer of the Day). If less than 4, the race will not be part of the race series.

## 2 ADVERTISING

2.1 Advertising will be restricted to Category A as noted in Clause 80.

## **3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

3.1 The races are open to all NHTYA members and visitors.

## 4 FEES

4.1 Required fees are as follows: 8 Race Series \$35.00, or \$10 per race till \$35.00 has been accrued. Fees are to be paid prior to participating in any race or the yacht will be scored DSQ.

## **5 RACE SERIES**

5.1 The race series will consist of 8 races.

#### 6 SCHEDULE

- 6.1 Registration is on the day of the race prior to briefing time. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the race briefing is Saturday 11.30am and Sunday 10.30am.
- 6.2 Dates of racing 2023, and designated OOD:

## 6.3 Number of races:

Division Numbers	Races per day
Divisions 1 to 3	One race on Saturdays and one race on Sundays. Except re-run races conducted as a second race on the next Saturday race day, or Sunday race day if required.

## 7 EQUIPMENT and MEASUREMENT CHECKS

7.1 A boat or its equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the Sailing Instructions.

On the water a boat may be instructed by a Race Committee Officer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

## **8 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

8.1 The sailing instructions will be available on the NHTYA web site www.trailersailer.org

#### 9 VENUE

- 9.1 The races will be conducted on Lake Macquarie in New South Wales.
- 9.2 The venue will be F-Jetty for races 1, 2, 3 and 4 and Styles Point for races 5, 6, 7 and 8. F Jetty races can be accessed by the ramp adjacent to F Jetty.
- 9.3 Directions for visitors: F-Jetty is at Rathmines NSW and is accessed by Dorrington Road or Stilling Street, with trailer yacht launching at Styles Point ramp. Styles Point is at Rathmines NSW and is accessed by Dorrington Road then Overhill Road. At the northern end of Overhill Road take the right turn into the park.

## **10 THE COURSES**

10.1 The courses to be sailed will be selected from the club Courses or as determined at the race briefing. (see the Sailing Instructions Addendum B). The race organiser will use the B.O.M/Meteye site for weather assessments.

## 11 PENALTY SYSTEM

11.1 Rule 44.1 (page 29) is changed so that the "Two Turn Penalty" is replaced by the "One Turn Penalty".

## 12 SCORING

- 12.1 The primary scoring system will be based on personal handicap (PHC) results utilising the "Top Yacht Club Score" software.
- 12.2 The secondary scoring system will be based on Class Basic Handicap (CBH) results utilising the "Top Yacht" software and is to be calculated by utilising each boat's elapsed time for each race conducted within the 2023 Spring Series and the 2024 Autumn Series and multiplied by the CBH for that class of boat. 80% of the best results for that boat to count towards the series. Class handicap ratings for the combined Spring and Autumn series will be those published on the Australian Sailing website at the date of the first Spring race.
- 12.3 Low point scoring system described in A4.1 will apply.
- 12.4 The Officer of the Day (OOD) shall be scored as a DUTY boat. DUTY boat can only be awarded on one occasion each series. Occasion being meant as one day's racing activities.

- 12.5 Any NHTYA Club Member absent from an NHTYA race because they are participating in another club's race on the same day will be scored as a "DUTY" boat and receive an average of her 4 best scores. This can only be applied once per race series.
- 12.6 Any Series Ties to be resolved using clause A8.

## 13 THE START and SUPPORT BOATS

13.1 The start will be between an Association buoy and a flag on the start boat, unless otherwise notified at the briefing. Committee Boats will be used as support boats as required.

#### 14 RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

14.1 All boats will monitor VHF Channel 72 while racing. A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. The club call sign is "Catalina Fleet".

#### 15 PRIZES

- 15.1 Prizes will be given as follows:
  - Medal for 1st 2nd & 3<sup>rd</sup> in each race on PHC.
  - Husband and wife/partner trophy for the first husband and wife/partner across the finish line in each race.
- 15.2 Trophies as follows:
  - Winner of the Spring 2023 Series based on PHC.
  - Winner of the combined Spring 2023 & Autumn 2024 Series based on PHC.
  - Winner of the combined Spring 2023 and Autumn 2024 Series based on CBH.
- 15.3 The <u>crew</u> of a prize winning boat (not being a spouse/partner of the owner):
  - Having paid club membership, and
  - Having paid race fees, and
  - Participated in a minimum of 80% of the races on that boat in that series shall be eligible for an individual award.

## **16 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

16.1 Competitors participate in races entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during, or after the series races.

## 17 INSURANCE

17.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with a valid third-party liability insurer with a minimum cover of \$10,000,000.00 per event or the equivalent.

## **18 PERSON IN CHARGE**

- 18.1 All yacht skippers must have current:
  - Sailing Australia membership.
  - Race fees paid.
  - Members of NHTYA must have current NHTYA club membership.

Failing any of these, the yacht will be scored as DSQ (Disqualified).
