

I also found from the chest xray I got in my tests that I have another crushed vertebrae, so the doctor has referred me to a specialist for that as well. Feels fine but he wants a specialist to check it.

So, I feel I am unable to commit the effort to this position that a VC should for the club. I very much appreciate the concern and calls I get, but because of these health issues, I have decided not to stand for re-election as Vice Commodore this May at the AGM.

It is because of this I am asking if anyone else in the club would be prepared to step up to fill this position. There are plenty of people with far greater knowledge of the club processes than me that are always willing to help. Past office bearers like Phil, Kev, Hart and Val are just a few who have always helped me when I needed it.

It's been an honour to be in this position in such a great club and that is due to the members.

I hope someone can help with this and maybe in the future I'll be back again.

Extracted from NHTYA constitution dated July 2019

#### 16. Constitution and membership of the Management Committee

- (1) The Management Committee is to consist of.
  - a) the office bearers of the association, and
  - b) 3 ordinary members, each of whom is to be elected at the annual general meeting of the association under rule 17.
- (2) The office bearers of the association are to be:
  - a) the commodore
  - b) the vice-commodore
  - c) the past-commodore
  - d) the treasurer, and
  - e) the secretary
- (3) Each member of the committee is, subject to these rules, to hold office until the conclusion of the annual general meeting following the date of the member's election, but is eligible for re-election subject to rule 16(4).
- (4) In the event of a casual vacancy occurring in the membership of the committee, the committee may appoint a member of the association to fill the vacancy and the

member so appointed is to hold office, subject to these rules, until the conclusion of the annual general meeting next following the date of the appointment.

#### 17. Election of members

- (1) Nominations of candidates for election as office bearers of the association or as ordinary members of the committee:
- a) Must be made in writing, signed by 2 members of the association and accompanied by the written consent of the candidate (which may be endorsed on the

form of the nomination), and

- b) must be delivered to the secretary of the association prior to the commencement of the annual general meeting at which the election is to take place.
- (2) If insufficient nominations are received to fill all vacancies on the committee, the candidates nominated are taken to be elected.
- (3) If insufficient nominations are received, any vacant positions remaining on the committee are taken to be casual vacancies and filled in accordance with rule 16(4).
- (4) If the number of nominations received is equal to the number of vacancies to be filled, the persons nominated are taken to be elected.
- (5) If the number of nominations received exceeds the number of vacancies to be filled, a ballot is to be held.
- (6) The ballot for the election of office bearers and ordinary members of the committee is to be conducted at the annual general meeting in such usual and proper manner as the committee may direct.






Easter Sunday morning and Easter eggs all round.

Yes, this is a mast up and sail cruise on waters that are familiar to us but has been some time since we 'sailed' these waters.


Club members have sailed these waters for Off the Beach national titles- but cruising is a more gentile

#### Races 5 Report - John Haig (Jocimo)

Race: #5. 2024

Course: Killaben Bay (Club Bouys 3 Laps)

Wind: 18 to 25 Knts (East end of course)

Start: Two Starts, Div 1 & 2. and Div 3

Race # 5 saw 8 boats start, Sabre 25 / two Farr 6s / two Boomerangs 20s div.1&2

and 3 Noelex 25s. In div.3

As we on Jocimo (Robin Parker on Tiller, and myself, Skipper and Tactician) headed out East of Killaben Bay we got a rude shock with the sail choice, Full Main and Std Headsail, the wind was very firm. We decided to ride it out with Robin doing an excellent job nursing the boat at the tiller, and at the same time chasing forward speed. Before we had reached the 1st mark two boats had retired, myself I was considering the same, Jocimo's mast was whipping about excessively, but decided if we were to Reef we would do it after Fishing Pt mark with wind protection, hum? From memory a 3rd boat retired from the race on the leg across to Fishing Pt. leaving 5 boats competing. After rounding Fishing Pt. it was then I decided a Headsail Change and Reef in the Main was in order, thus the remaining boats overtook us. I was up front changing down to a # 3 Headsail, when Robin exclaimed Jocimo was doing 9.4 knots on the Mainsail only. Unfortunately while I was changing the Headsail we broke the Traveller Car, being un able

to help Robin cushion the Main Sheet when on a Jibe, so I made a make do one from cord rapped around the Traveller to get us out of trouble.

Now the issue was to reel in the boats ahead, I gather we were now last in the fleet, with work to do. Well the rest is history, Jocimo performed remarkably well with the new Sail Plan, and Robin was having a ball on the Tiller. We lost ground in Killaben Bay with wind protection from the land, but more then made up back out in the bay proper. Our Duty Officers Peter and Kerry made a good decision to shorten the race to 2 laps. By the Fishing Pt club mark Jocimo was in front and had enough lead to get us over the Finish Line in 1st place, and still hold off "Eye See Red "approximately 1 minute behind.

Thanks to our Duty Officers, Peter and Kerry / Brian Race Handicapper and Val, for setting the course, and the use of their Stink Boat. (2 Stinky).
